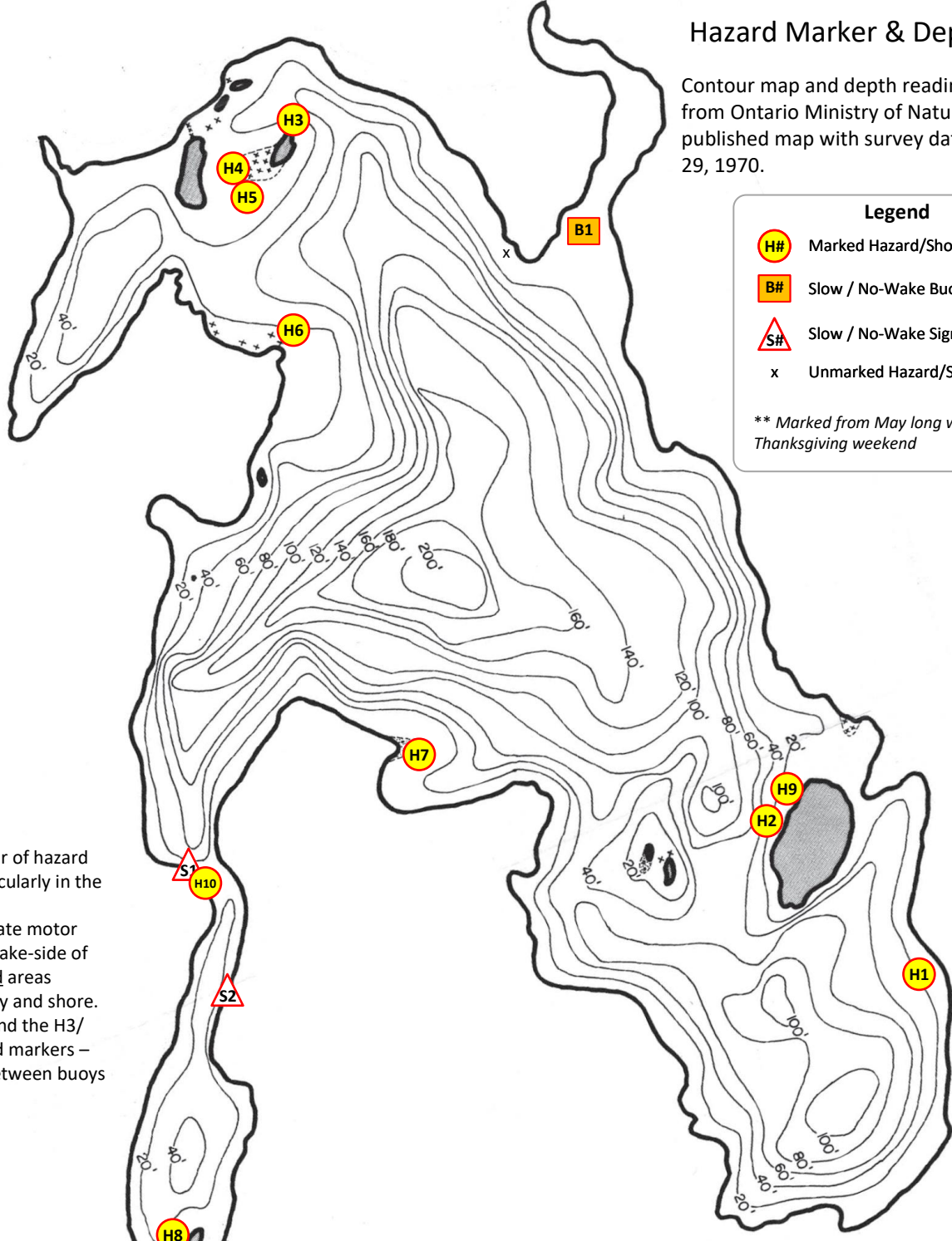

Navigation Tips

- Stay well clear of hazard buoys – particularly in the late season.
- Always navigate motor boats to the lake-side of buoys – avoid areas between buoy and shore.
- Caution around the H3/ H4/H5 hazard markers – avoid area between buoys and island.
